- · Applications will be viewed by SkillsUSA Georgia Personnel
- The number of voting delegates to be chosen may very year-to-year and will depend on the number of slots available
- Announcement of National Voting Delegates will be communicated via email to the advisor and student
- Register your voting delegate by April 27, 2018.
